We saw the creation of two new clubs this year, one junior club - the LGB Jets based in Geneva - and one senior club, Val de Bagnes in Valais/Wallis. We welcome both clubs into our netball family and wish them the very best success in the netball world and beyond.

Matchplay

This season we organized three junior matchplays and two senior matchplays, all of which, to date, were well attended. Matchplays offer a more informal setting for players and umpires in training. Particular thanks go to the coaches who were involved in the junior scratch plays that allowed court time for everyone.

National League

The Swiss Netball National League expanded to a third division and continued with fixture dates and venues across the country making it a truly national league. The season started strongly but unfortunately saw a spate of forfeits towards the end of the season. We hope the National League will maintain the starting momentum next season.

Officiating

We have appointed a new Officiating Lead, Jana Maritz, this season who took over from Carol D'Alberti. We would like to thank Carol for the invaluable work she has done for Officiating in Switzerland.

During the season, an Into Umpiring Course and a Europe Netball C Award Course were delivered, with Swiss Netball's in-country Europe Netball C Award Assessors undertaking several assessments. Europe Netball Assessors and Mentors visited Switzerland to provide mentoring and undertake B Award assessments. We are proud to have gained 4 new C Award Umpires and 2 new B Award Umpires in the 2023-2024 season. Congratulations to you all!

An Umpiring Mentor Programme has been introduced and trialled, over two weekends, towards the end of the season and we are looking forward to have it formally implemented in the 2024-2025 season.

We bid farewell with our eternal thanks to both Helen Ashton and John Sturgess. Helen has retired from her role as Europe Netball Theory Tutor after 5 years and John has retired as a C Award Umpire.

PROGRESS INTERNATIONAL SUCCESS

We started the season with a new Head Coach, Mollie Brodie, complemented by Assistant Coaches Jess Brown, Annette Waterman, Bronwyn McGinity and Marneylea Browne. For the first time, Swiss Netball entered a team in the inaugural Europe Netball U21 Combined Event placing 4th in the division. We continued the season with the 2024 U17 Europe Netball Challenge event, placing 4th in our division with Brooke MacDonald winning Players Player – very well deserved!

Ahead of the Europe Netball Open Challenge, we hosted some international friendlies with Sweden, the Valley Vipers (France) and Dinas Devils (Wales) that we hope to have as a permanent fixture moving forwards. I wish our Open team success!

Our sincere thanks are extended to our previous Head Coach, Vanessa McErlain-Naylor, and Assistant Coaches Jess Brown and Marneylea Browne who stepped down during the season. Thanks too for our National Squad Team Manager, Emma Connolly, and National Squad Assistant Team Manager, Luisa Jud, who have made organization look effortless.

REINFORCE SWISS NETBALL FOUNDATIONS

Another first was the introduction of the Club Council to raise, debate and make proposals to the Committee regarding Swiss Netball policies, procedures, strategies and organisational improvements. A total of 16 proposals were covered during the year.

Based on this, we have also reviewed and revised our Swiss Netball Strategy which will be presented at the AGA.
